What Is an Ice Dam?

An ice dam is a ridge of ice that forms along the edge of a roof, trapping melting snow behind it. As this trapped water pools, it can back up under the shingles and leak directly into your attic and home.

The formation process begins when heat escaping from your home warms the roof deck, melting snow on top. This water flows down until it reaches the colder eaves, where it refreezes and builds up into a dam.

Shingle & Roof Surface Damage

The pressure from trapped, freezing water can lift, crack, and dislodge shingles. This allows moisture to penetrate the underlayment and causes the roofing materials to degrade prematurely, shortening your roof's lifespan significantly.



Interior & Structural Damage

Once water breaches the roof surface, it can leak into the attic, soaking insulation and drastically reducing its R-value. From there, it can drip through to stain ceilings and walls, promote mold growth, and eventually cause the underlying wood decking and structural rafters to rot and warp.

The sheer weight of a large ice dam can bend gutters or pull them away from the house entirely. As the dam melts and refreezes, the overflowing water can also saturate and rot the wooden fascia boards behind the gutters.


